#### neunerhaus

#### Founded in 1999

- as bottom-up initiative
- as a reaction to the political denial of homelessness as a social issue
- to overcome homelessness and fight for the human 'right to housing'

#### the right to housing to neunerhaus means ...

- ... to help people in a situation of homelessness and at risk of poverty to help themselves living a human and self-determined life.
- ... to fight restricted access to municipal housing in Vienna > so called ,entrance criteria often mean exclusion criteria for our target group
- ... to seperate support by social work and the general access to housing
- ... to participate actively in the discourse on housing politics and claim afforfdable housing also for socially deprived parts of our society

Housing as a human right.


Moving away from a ,Staircase model' way of working.

Housing First puts access to affordable housing at the beginning of the support, rather than at the end.




# Housing First - Deinstitutionalisation





## Housing First – Core Principles



#### Eight core principles:

- Housing is a Human Right
- Separation of housing and treatment
- Harm reduction
- Person-centred planning

- Choice and control for service users
- Recovery orientation
- Active engagement without coercion
- Flexible Support for as Long as is Required



## neunerhaus Housing First

In 2010 the administrative agreement between the Red- and the Green Party states: "... whereby the Housing First approach should be reinforced"

Spring 2011: neunerhaus research about "Housing First in Vienna"

2011/2012: development of professional standards in cooperation with service providers and the funding authority FSW - process design by neunerhaus and FSW. Final report: "Housing First. Vienna's model"



## neunerhaus Housing First

#### Started 2012 as first Pilot Project with Housing First Apporach in Vienna

- monitored through an external evaluation by L&R Sozialforschung, taken over as a regular service in September 2015
- Relaying an affordable and need fitting flat with long-term rental contract at the start of support
- care offer as intensive and as long as needed
- 2016 interdisciplinary team: social work and psycho-social health
- Councelling centre for former clients without deadline





#### Core Principles of neunerhaus Housing First

- Direct access to own and permanent housing
- Promoting social inclusion
- Separation of housing management and social support
- Self-determination and participation
- Flexible support for individual needs



# Housing First cooperation model



## neunerhaus Housing First – facts and figures

#### In 2018:

139 signed rental agreements – support for 171 adults and 149 children

- single households 47%
- couples 4%
- families with children 49%
- 6272,65m2 for an average square meter price of € 7,20

high housing stability, only 8 evictions 94% of housing stability - international comparison: between 75%- 97% while the durations of the projects is in currently shorter



# neunerhaus Housing First – facts and figures II

#### In 2018:

In 2018 support for 155 persons in 60 households

- 42 women 59% of the adults
- 29 men
- 84 children

In addition an average of 36 households per month makes use of the follow up support.

- also a while after ending the initial support: for half of the service users the end of the initial support was about 2 years ago

Average duration of support in 2018: 20 month

September 2019: around 150 signed rental agreements



# offered support services I

#### counseling and support during the renting process

- -assessing the affordability of offered accommodation
- -preparation of the rental arrangement
- -helping to organize the move


#### flexible support in accordance with the individual needs


- -counseling in case of financial and social problems
- -support during times of an individual crisis
- -counseling for family relationship, education, employment etc.
- -support if there are problems with neighbors or the property management
- -how to secure the housing



# offered support services II

- -counseling and support for health issues mainly for psychological and mental health problems
- -Find external medical and mental health services, and accompany the use
- -support with daily life and leisure activities
- -support social inclusion

# Interdisciplinarity

- expanding the team towards psychosocial health care specialists
- clients have many needs related toward mental and physical health care
- Housing First as an offer also fits the needs of people who have difficulties in an institutional context, and therefore had moved from one organization to the other
- effectiveness of external mental health services is sometimes limited

The interdisciplinary team: 8 social workers, 2 employees for psychosocial health care (nurse and psychologist), manager, civilian servant



#### Follow Up Support

- getting in touch is easy and can happen anytime possible
- duration is flexible according to the needs (one time contacts up to several month)
- secure the housing effectively (often in correlation with securing a livelihood)
- support through a crisis
- service agreement in case someone asks again for longterm support
- Housing First takes action when notified about an impending housing loss
